COLBORNE – The best of fine music and art are on display at the Colborne Art Gallery.

The gallery, at 51 King Street E., Colborne, hosts Gallery Music on June 6, starting at 7:30 p.m. The evening includes musical entertainment courtesy of painter and violinist, Port Hope's San Murata; guitarist, Tony Quarrington; Beverly Taft on vocals; along with special guest Dave Field on upright bass.

The Colborne Art Gallery is located in the former historic East Northumberland Land Registry Office. Founded in 1997, the gallery is home of the Colborne Society of Artists.

The society is a collective that brings together a diverse group of creative people working independently in a variety of media. Their
